Binge drinking: 39.6% 48% (Cook et al, 2006) Abuse/dependence 23.6% 33% Hutton et al study in STD clinic also found high rates of binge drinking among women (30%) and men (42%); for women relationship between binge drinking, risky sexual behavior, and gonorrhea

Binge Eating Disorder (BED) •Recurring episodes of eating significantly more food in a short period of time than most people would eat under similar circumstances with episodes marked by feelings of lack of control •Marked distress including feelings of guilt, embarrassment, or disgust •Occurs on average once per week over 3 months

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Eating Disorders

Binge Eating ! Eating a greater amount of food in a fixed period of time (eg, 2 hours) than what most people would eat in the same time period and circumstances AND ! Accompanied by a sense of lack of control over what and how much one is eating Other characteristics: • May be planned or spontaneous!
