LOUIS BRAILLE January 4, 1809 - January 6, 1852 Louis Braille invented the raised dot system of reading and writing for the blind and visually impaired This tactile method permits the specially trained user to pass their fingers over embossed dots and “decode” the corresponding letters or symbols

Who was Louis Braille? The Braille system of reading and writing was developed by a Frenchman named Louis Braille when he was just a boy He became blind through an accident, and he discovered that trying to read raised letters was much too slow He wanted a faster way for blind people to read and write
